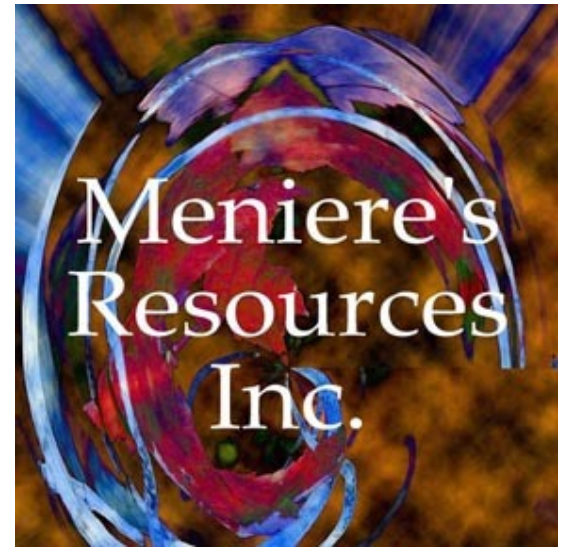

What is Ménière's Disease?

Ménière's Disease is a rare, little-understood inner ear disorder.

Ménière's is characterized by (1) whirling and incapacitating vertigo, nausea and vomiting (2) roaring or seashell-type tinnitus in the affected ear(s) (3) fluctuating hearing loss with sound distortion and poor speech discrimination (4) fullness and pressure in the ear(s). These recurring attacks are episodic and may last from an hour to several days.

Over time, both the hearing and vestibular (balance) systems continue to be damaged causing decreased hearing and speech comprehension, unsteadiness and lack of equilibrium, and "brain fog." This decline often contributes to increased anxiety and depression.

Every patient is different and the progression of the disease varies for each person. It is not uncommon for the early symptoms to be hearing fluctuation, fullness, pressure, and tinnitus. These symptoms are unpredictable and life-changing. Some of the symptoms can stop fluctuating and become permanent.

The cause of Ménière's Disease remains unknown. Treatment options often are ineffective or offer temporary relief. There is no cure.

What can be done?

Meniere's Resources, Inc. is made up of people just like you who lived their lives, enjoyed their families, and developed talents and careers.



Suddenly everything turned upside down and our lives changed. Because we do not have a celebrity spokesperson, we have formed Meniere's Resources, Inc. to provide educational assistance and support programs, assisted living options, counseling and coping skills, assisted listening technology, balance and tinnitus rehabilitation, and disability and discrimination information.

We have joined together in a grass roots effort to support one another. We have a long-term goal of establishing an assisted living facility for those suffering from vestibular disorders, and to find resources to research a cure.

How can you help?

Balance is the sixth sense. Doctors know little about the disease and patients are left to struggle on their own without adequate information to make knowledgeable decisions about their treatment and care. In the past we have remained largely silent and isolated – and as a result even our families and friends often do not know how to support us.
